Previous Minutes: Minutes of the previous AG.M. At the Taumarunui Golf Club on the 17th April 2012 having been circulated in the March Bulletin were taken as read. No matters arising.

Approved and signed as a true and correct record on the Motion of Nigel Messenger, and seconded by Graham Wakelin Carried.

A minute of silence was requested to remember and respect those of the Association that had passed away during the year.

President's Report: President Richard Davison read and tabled his Annual Report which was received and approved by the members present.

Moved, Nigel Messenger Seconded by John Dalton carried.

Financial Report: The Audited Financial Statement and Balance Sheet of the Association for the year ended 31st December 2012, having been circulated in the March Bulletin, was tabled and *approved on the motion of Stuart Huddleston, Seconded by Cliff Lally Carried.*

The Secretary reported a small profit was made for the current year due to the renegotiated printing and audit costs, and an excellent profit from the Nationals at Taumarunui.

Subscriptions: Nigel Messenger wanted to know why the subs for 2013 were not raised to \$30 as voted for at the previous AGM. The Secretary replied that as the Association was in good heart financially and the Association had shown a profit, the first for some years that he felt it was not appropriate to raise them at this time.

Another vote was taken, and the \$30 sub was reaffirmed by a narrow margin.

Later in the year at our delegate meeting, the matter was again discussed and it was unanimously agreed to send accounts for subs for \$30, reduced to \$25 if paid by 31/1.

General: Richard Davison has resigned as Otago/Southland Delegate having moved out of the area.

The Secretary advised that our constitution allowed that our President need not be a delegate and *moved that Richard be re-elected President. Seconded Laurence Butler.*

John Barber advised that we had a number of widows around the country that may be interested in becoming an associate member for a reduced fee to enable them to keep in contact. *Moved John and seconded Ian Mackay*

It was agreed that GPS would be allowed but no cell phones at our National Tournaments.

John Barber moved that the minimum age for seniors entering the Nationals be raised from 55 to 60 years, adding that opinion today was that our 65 year olds are like 55 year olds a generation back. *Seconded Michael Quinlan, Carried.*

Nigel Messenger raised the subject of Super Seniors and suggested that they play the 4 days, but from the yellow tees, discussion followed whether the 2 days should be at the start or the finish of the Tournament, or 4 days off the yellow.

It was decided to leave to the Board to come up with a solution that will be happily received by those concerned.

Neville Lucas suggested that we go back to having our Nationals over 5 days with a rest on the middle day, Neville so moved, and was seconded by Nigel Messenger. Further discussion followed regarding the pros and cons, a vote was held and the continuation of the 4 days concurrently was carried by a good margin.

Meeting finished at 6.25pm.
