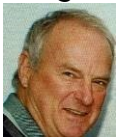
I wish you and your families a very Merry Xmas and a happy golfing New Year. I look forwards to catching up with many of you in 2021.

When Sir Bob came to Otatara in November 2020 60 years after the 1960 NZ Open in which he played, and was third to Thompson and Nagle and won £50, I thought it would be nice if he physically presented the trophy to me after only 53 years hence this photo. I shot a 70 at the Sir Bob tournament on November 22 2020

and luckily broke my age for only the second time. I did shoot 69 12 months ago when I was 71(mind you the 69 did include hole in one)

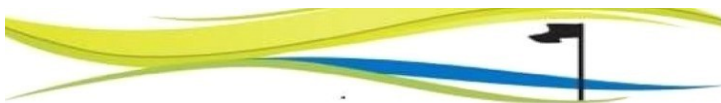

It never seems to amaze me that during a game of golf, there are those who have eyes that can see through, round and over trees to tell me where my ball is. "It's just past that tree." "What tree is this? There are heaps down there."

Then there are those who sledge, yeh I call it sledging. I have just missed the hole with a 6-metre putt and yes here it comes: "Bad luck." "Hey senorita, there is no bad luck, that was a great effort on my behalf."

Then there is the commentator, they must tell you everything about your shot if not about your shot then it will be about there's and if you don't reply with at least an OK, they will repeat it again.

I stand on the tee, ready to drive. I know as soon as I hit the ball, they are going to make a comment. Yep, sure thing. When next they stand on the tee, I sneeze. One-all.

Player Profile

Sir Robert James Charles ONZ (2010) KNZM (1991) OBE (1972) elevated to CBE (1992) (born 14 March 1936) is a New Zealand professional golfer. His achievements over five decades rank him among the most successful left-handed golfers of all time, being the first lefty to win a golf major, winning more than 70 titles, and beating his age twice during a tournament as a 71-year-old. Although Bob plays golf left-handed, he is naturally right-handed.



Bob turned professional in Oct. 1960 and the next year ventured overseas to the European and North American circuits, winning the Bowmaker (UK) and the NZ.P.G.A.

In 1963, Bob won his first PGA Tour event in the United States, the Houston Classic, the first PGA Tour event won by a left-handed golfer. Later that year he won The Open Championship at Royal Lytham and St. Annes. After four rounds (68-72-66-71) his 277 was level with American Phil Rodgers. Bob won the 36-hole playoff by eight shots.

Bob has won 80 tournaments around the world. As well as his PGA Tour victories, his win in the 1969 World Matchplay Championship was considered one of his best. He won the Senior British Open 30 years after winning his British Open title in 1993 having also won in 1989. In 2007 Bob became the oldest golfer to make a cut on the European Tour at the Michael Hill New Zealand Open. He shot a 68 in the second round, beating his age by three strokes. Bob's move to the Senior PGA Tour (now called PGA Tour Champions) was very lucrative and successful with 23 titles; and in three years 1988, 1989 and 1993, he recorded lowest scoring average. He finished second on the European Seniors Tour's 2007 Wentworth Senior Masters at the age of 71. He was the first left-hander to win a major, and also the first lefty to be inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame, in the veterans' category in 2008. He would remain the only lefty inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame until Phil Mickelson was elected in 2011. At the Senior British Open Championship in 2010, Bob announced in an ESPN interview that he would retire from tournament golf, stating that he was "74 years old, travelling the world for 50 years, and it's time to slow down and spend more time on my farm.

Bob with his wife Verity have two children, Beverly and David. David is a Senior director of Championships for the PGA in the United States. Bob as a successful golf course designer had input into the Formosa Country Club, Millbrook, The Dunes and Clearwater. He was also a consultant to the Clearwater course,
